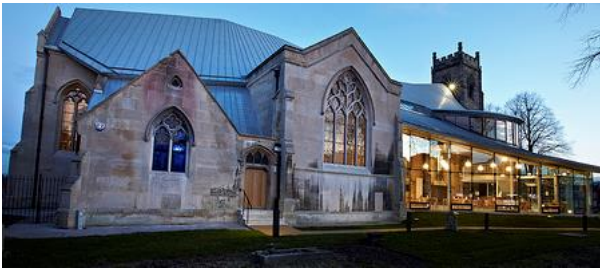


School website content that will reflect the vision and Christian character of your school:

Church links



Do you have a picture of the parish church on the landing page?
Do you have links to the parish church website?
Do you mention your parish priest by name, and mention their involvement with the school?
Do you include news from the church anywhere on your site?
Are there photos of activities that the church and the school do together?
Do you share stories of church life on the school website?

Have you a link to the diocesan website www.birminghamdbe.org.uk ?

Christian vision

Do you have an obvious section on the distinctively Christian vision and associated values? Do you explain when this vision was created and who was involved in establishing them? It is valid for people to know whether they have been the same for ten years, or whether they have been developed with this cohort.

Do you explain how the vision and supporting values are rooted in Biblical teaching?

Do you include anywhere a summary of your school development plan, including your church school priorities?

Do you mention your governors, and how they monitor the effectiveness of the Christian vision?

Do you include policies which significantly demonstrate how you live out your vision?:

SIAMS report

Is your school's previous SIAMS report in a place that is easy to find? Do you use any of the complimentary phrases from within it to highlight your life as a church school? Bear in mind that Ofsted look at this to confirm governors carried out their statutory duty to ensure SIAMS has taken place. They may also note how leaders have addressed areas identified for improvement.

Life as a church school

Does your site display photographs of spaces for worship, prayer/reflection spaces, outdoor areas, events, displays... (as permissions allow if images contain pupils/family members)?

Do you give examples of charitable causes the school has supported and the reasons they were chosen?

Do you publicise your partnerships with local, national or international groups, developed because you are a church school? This includes religious communities in your area.

Do you announce results of surveys or questionnaires related to the Christian character, RE and worship?



Collective worship

Do you describe your provision for collective worship, and any schemes or supporting materials used regularly?

Do you show plans, themes, rotas for collective worship?

Do you explain how pupils are involved in leading worship?

Do you identify how prayer takes place in your school?

You must include information about the legal parental right of withdrawal.

Religious Education

Do you explain your RE curriculum and how RE is taught (including KS5, where appropriate)?

Do you show how RE reflects the Church of England Statement for Entitlement for the subject?

Do you provide a link to your locally agreed syllabus (if you make use of it)?

Do you give examples of the kinds of learning tasks pupils undertake in RE?

You must include information about the legal parental right of withdrawal.
